He loved to shoot and if you messed with him, he would show you how good of a shooter he was. He was once asked by his daughter Rashana, "Eddie can you fight?" His response was, "I'm a Gaines, of course I can fight but I rather shooting, Darling."

Edward, a veteran of the United States Army, he lived a life of contentment and fulfilled his desires. Eddie transitioned on October 19, 2021. He is predeceased by his parents, his first born, Randy Gaines and four siblings, Douglas Gaines, Margaret Gaines Booker, Lizzie Middleton and Ever Richberg.
