As a child Cathy attended Nicholas Murray Butler Elementary School No. 23 and graduated from Battin High School in Elizabeth, New Jersey in 1976. During her middle and high school years she participated in a plethora of activities. She was very active and popular in both middle and high schools. She played the flute, sang in the choir, was a member of the Booster Squad and a cheer leader. As a young adult, Cathy was very involved in Mount Teman AME Church in Elizabeth where she served as a youth mentor and member of the Junior Choir.

After graduating from high school, Cathy worked in the areas of administrative assistant and customer service for the following businesses: Concern Incorporated, Toys R Us, Mikasa China Company, Muhlenberg Hospital, and Chubb and Son Insurance Company from 1976 through 1988. In 1979, Cathy attended and earned a certificate from The First School of Secretarial in East Orange, New Jersey. Additionally, she attended Union County College in Cranford, New Jersey, where she received her Associate Degree in Science in January 2021. Cathy was extremely proud of achieving this accomplishment.

During her dedicated employment at Mikasa China Company she met her future husband, Herman Battle. After two years of dating, they were married at St. Luke A.M.E. Zion Church in Westfield, New Jersey in May 1988. Cathy and Herman were blessed with two sons, Mark and Kyle.

Cathy continued her employment first at the Plainfield School District and then at East Orange School District, both in New Jersey, as a Community Outreach Coordinator where she excelled and thrived. She organized parents' workshops, established Parents and Teachers Organizations (PTOs), and held fundraisers for field trips for students and parents to increase their cultural knowledge and global awareness. Cathy received many awards and certificates for her untiring and devoted service to students, staff, and administration in both school districts.

Cathy was full of life. She was cheerful, energetic, thoughtful and had an infectious smile that would light up any room. She was a giving person and often while driving she would stop her car or make you stop your car when she witnessed people who were less fortunate and gave them money. She collected winter coats for children in the school, organized Toys for Tots and established a food pantry in the school for the needy families.

Cathy leaves to cherish her memory her husband, Herman, who was the love of her life, two sons, Kyle, and Mark (Renata), three sisters Carla Dent, Diane Clark (Shelton), Cindy Dent (Danielle Scott), two brothers, Derek Dent (Elizabeth "Betty") and Carl Dent Jr., her aunt Lorraine Keyes, as well as a host of grandchildren, nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends. 'Cause I'm a woman


Ehenomenally.
