**Joshua** was born Friday, November 4, 1988 at 10:00 p.m. in Castries, St. Lucia. His nickname in the nursery was "Baby King" for he was the only boy amongst several baby girls born that weekend. At 7 years old, Joshua, his sister Dionne and I migrated to the United States.

Several times when I wanted to have a conversation about something I felt was important he would always say "mom I got to go to a meeting or mom I got to make moves, I love you mommy" then hang up the telephone or be out the door. I am missing everything about my baby. On September 24, 2021 was the last telephone conversation I had with my son. During that time he told me about dropping his music. He told me "Mommy I am doing this for you so you will never have to struggle again". He repeated, "mom it's going to happen, and then I will fulfill my dream of creating my own clothing line". A lifetime dream he worked hard to achieve. As a child and into his adulthood he watched me work tirelessly as a Retail Manager in the Fashion Industry, because of this he always credited me for inspiring him to work towards his dream of creating his own clothing line.

My son constantly told me, "mom, I am going to make you proud of me". I always answered "honey, I am always proud of you". Joshua was no Saint and made mistakes like all of us; yet I am honored that Almighty God gave me the privilege to be his mother in the thirty-two years of his life. I love him for who he was. Joshua leaves behind many loved ones, his sister, nieces, aunts, grandmother, uncles, cousins, his two adopted mothers (Tatiana and Monica) and numerous friends.

Many may disagree with me, yet I know in my heart Heaven has gained a son, brother, friend, and a loving kind human being. Joshua, I know you are present here today and I want to let you know mommy loves you so much and in my heart you will live forever and always. I look forward to the day when we will meet again my beloved son, save a space for me A\$AP Jiggy Josh, my handsome son.
