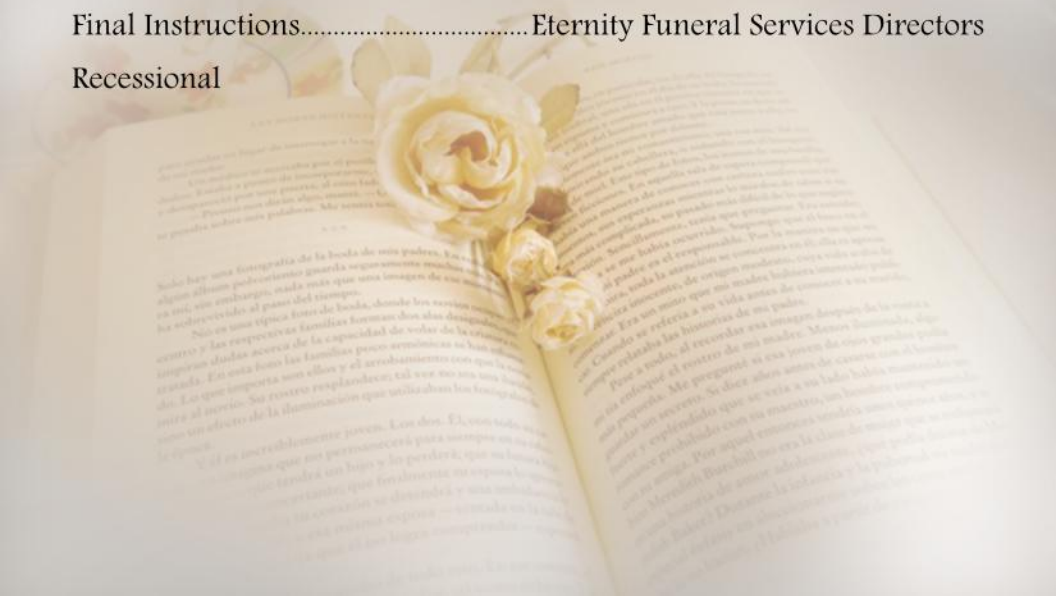

# Obituary
