That's what friends are for when it's a downfall.

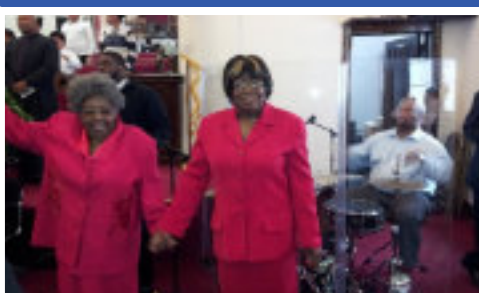
You may mourn the lost of one or more.

Just know in your heart that your friendship was pure.

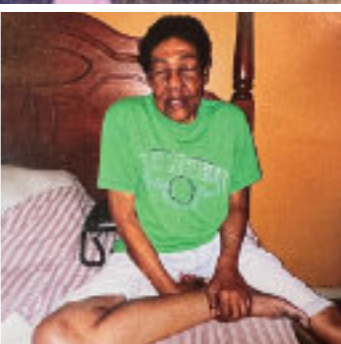
Don't be sad for the friendship that came to an end.

Family, like branches on a tree, we all grow and go in different directions, yet our roots remain as one.

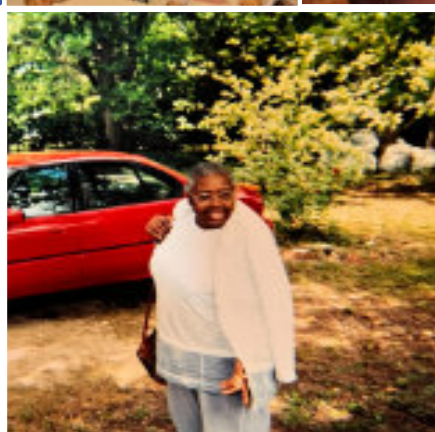
