Earl James Laycock Jr. was born in Harlem, NY on October 25, 1957 to Earl Laycock Sr. and Mary R. Lewis. Earl was the eldest of two children. Earl brought his infectious smile and laughter, over the top personality, and amazing moves as he danced his way into the hearts of fans and all who had the wonderful privilege of knowing him. Earl was also a devout Christian where he was beloved by his extended family of St. John's Baptist Church.

Earl Laycock Jr. was called home on November 1, 2021. Earl is preceded in death by his father, Earl Laycock Sr. and Mother, Mary R. Lewis.
