

The Murphy family moved to Morristown, NJ where Linda attended public schools and excelled in academics, athletics, and extracurricular activities. After graduating from high school, she obtained a degree in Psychology from Marietta College in Marietta, Ohio and a teaching certificate in mathematics and psychology. Most recently, she developed programs that assist children, families, teachers, and staff during the Covid-19 Pandemic which continue to serve the city to the present day.

Linda's life and legacy is most exemplified through her primary focus, service to Christ. She received Christ as her Lord and Savior at an early age. She was a devoted and active member of Calvary Baptist Church of Morristown, NJ where she joyfully served the Lord. She was instrumental in starting the "Summer Youth Program" which helped young minds grow within the realm of church, academics, and fun. Whether as an usher or trustee, Linda welcomed members and visitors alike with open arms and a loving smile. Her ministry extended outside the church where she fed the hungry, clothed those in need and housed family and friends in need of temporary housing. Linda dedicated her life to the service of others and her family.

In her spare time, Linda along with "Her Girls" Sandra, Roxaynne, Charlene, Loraine, Denise, Carolyn, Sandra, Linda, and Vicki enjoyed traveling, "Movie Days" going to Broadway, and much more. Linda also enjoyed hosting cook outs for The Morristown High School Math department. Gathering with family was also a joy.
