Obituary

Adassa Wright (nee Limonius) was born in Trelawny Jamaica, to Terrance and Amanda Limonius on March 24, 1935. She is the fourth of nine children from this union: Ira, Doselyn, Viola, Leslie, Beryl, Dorothy, Gloria and Huntley. Her surviving siblings are Doselyn, Leslie, Beryl, Dorothy, Gloria and Huntley.

In 1953, at the age of 18 she went to Kingston to find work and then in 1959 she migrated to the United Kingdom like many of the Windrush generation to help rebuild the country and in pursuit of a better life. Upon arrival she lived with her family in Stoke Newington (East London), and in 1962 she married Leon Wright. In 1970, her family left Stoke Newington and moved to Peckham (South London) where she worked in the lab for the Polytechnic of South Bank.

Work aside, Adassa was full of life and loved to dress up and go dancing; she was quite the fashionista and loved to sew clothes for herself and her children.

By the mid 1970's, once again looking for better opportunities, she migrated to America and settled in Morristown NJ, where she worked as a nanny for several years until she landed a job at Morristown Memorial Hospital on the maternity ward housekeeping department. She was extremely hard working and juggled several other jobs in addition to her full-time work to provide for her children.

After retiring from the hospital, she would spend her time traveling to Jamaica to soak up the sun and to England to see her family. She loved to listen to gospel music, especially The Grace Thrillers from Jamaica. She joined the local YMCA's (Morristown and Madison) where she learned to swim and loved to hang out with her numerous friends.

She was a member of the Seventh Day Adventist Church of Morristown, where she enjoyed the fellowship of congregation and her dear friends.

Adassa was the life of the party. She loved to sing, dance, and make everyone laugh with her jokes. Among those who mourn her loss are her three children: Michael, Marlene, and Paul, five grandchildren, four great grandchildren, siblings, nieces, nephews, cousins, and her dear friends from the Seventh day Adventist of Morristown.

Adassa breathed her last breath on October 25, 2021, after battling Alzheimer's for seven years. She has entered her sweet rest with assurance of the blessed hope of reuniting with her loved ones.
