

Miriam Alethea Foster was born on September 20th, 1929, in Aberdeen, St, Elizabeth, Jamaica, West Indies. The younger of two sisters, born to Mr. and Mrs. Felix Brown, she migrated to the United States with her family in 1979.

She completed her early elementary and high school education in Kingston, Jamaica, and worked in retail on Kings Street for years. Her marriage to Newton Hollingsworth Foster in 1950, until his death in 2012 in the Bronx, produced one son, and three daughters. With both parents' encouragement they gained post baccalaureate degrees in education/ teaching, medicine, nursing and accounting respectively.

"Mom", "Mummy" "Grandma" were monikers for our mother at different stages. She had a beautiful singing voice, was the peacemaker, the housewife, and also a volunteer at The Jewish Home for the Aged for years. She attended church regularly even when she relocated to Queens to live with her daughter. She was known for her handbags, wearing her high heeled half-length boots, even at 90 years of age, and colorful dresses to church and other functions.

She was active until a year into the pandemic when her excursions were curtailed. Continuing issues with fragile mental health, osteoporosis, and her heart resulted in admission, in August, 2021, to the local hospital and Nursing Home. She died on October 31st, 2021.

She is predeceased by daughter, Michelle.

She is survived by son: Newton, daughters: Sharon and Karen. granddaughters: Stephanie and Danielle, and grandsons: Trevor jr. and Anthony.

Her hugs, smiles and encouraging words of love, will be missed by family and friends.
