Willie Edgar Hughes was born on September 28, 1923 in Georgetown County, South Carolina to the marital union between Mrs. Sylvia Hicks-Hughes and Harrison Hughes. Both parents predeceased him. Willie Hughes surpassed his siblings; Henry Hughes, James Thomas Hughes (aka JT) and Alese Hughes Rice.

On May 2, 1945, he enlisted into the United States Navy while working as a First Class Seaman before being honorably discharged. During his tour, Willie earned a World War II Victory Medal, American Area Campaign Medal, and Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal.

Willie Hughes' career did not end there. He continued his travels and moved to Harlem, New York in 1954. On May 16, 1959, Willie Hughes was united in holy matrimony to the former Ms. Brady Lee Lovett. In 1970, they became members of The Family Baptist Church located in The Bronx. Willie Hughes possessed a strong work ethic as a diligent carpenter and later retired with the New York City Carpentry Union in 1985. Upon retirement, Bill remained active. He and his wife successfully participated in various bowling leagues and competitions through out the New York City area. In 1991, he became Deacon Willie Hughes of New Mount Zion Baptist Church while finding great joy when caring for his great-grand children who continue to admire their hero.

On the evening of Wednesday, November 17, 2021 while at home, Willie Hughes ascended into eternal life rejoining his wife; Mrs. Brady Lee Hughes. Those who shared his joys and cherished his fond memories are his loving daughter and son; Betty Jane of Bronx, NY (deceased) and Eddie James of Peekskill, NY; 21 grandchildren, 54 great grandchildren, 20 great-great grandchildren, and a host of great-great-great grandchildren, nieces, nephews, other loving relatives and friends.
