Nate was such a huge pillar of strength to his family, friends, and community, always going above and beyond to help everyone in any way possible and never complained. He enjoyed life's most simple things and it didn't take much of anything to please him. The highlight of his day probably was going to the corner store buying scratch offs and playing the lottery and no one could get in the way of that. He was also a die-hard NY Giants fan. He also was very structured with his daily schedule of taking the trash out, making sure everything was tidy, watching his favorite TV shows, listening to his "oldies but goodies" music on his transistor radio, and walking nearly four miles every day. Nate loved being with his family at cookouts, family gatherings, dancing when the music played, and enjoyed eating especially when our sister Paula made his famous liverwurst sandwiches. Going to church was epic for Nate. He loved attending Grace Bible Class Church. He loved when the Holy Spirit moved him then he would stand up to high-five whoever was seated near him.

Nate kept a watchful eye on his younger siblings mainly us, Pam whom he called "Bae Bae", Tommy, and Portia, who absolutely ran him crazy! He also had a nickname for everyone near and dear to him, he was also the best uncle to all his nieces and nephews, taking great care of them whenever he was asked and even when they were dropped off unannounced.

Nate's health became an issue late last year with several hospital stays. In between the hospital stays while at home our sister Paula and brother-in-law (Pickett) effortlessly took great care of him until they were no longer able to do so with the faithful helping hands of our sister Priscilla as well. Working in shifts our siblings Robert, Pamela, Shelly, and nephew Garey made it possible to keep Nate groomed because he would be sure to call them repeatedly when he wanted to be clean shaved and get his hair cut. Our oldest niece Alexis would stop by the house often after leaving work in the evening to massage uncle Nate's feet and legs in hope of easing his pain. When Paula needed help getting Nate ready for his doctor's appointments our nephews Brandon, Devin, and even Robert (Boba) would be right there always ready to assist with moving uncle Nate. As the phrase says, "a family that prays together stays together", we can all attest to that!

Nate was preceded in death by his parents; Jessica M. (Edwards)White, Nathan White, Sr., and his brother; Lester White.

He departed this life on Friday, November 19, 2021.
