
In Loving Memory of Deacon John E. Smith III

Obituary

John E. "Smitty" Smith III was born on January 3, 1945, to the late Lucille Danzy Smith and John Smith Sr. in Halifax Co. N.C. making Smitty the eldest of his many siblings. Smitty's family later moved to Conetoe, NC where Smitty attended Conetoe High School and was one of the star basketball players. After graduating from high school Smitty ventured to Virginia Beach, VA before permanently relocating to Newark, NJ with his late cousin Sam.

One short year later, Smitty met the love of his life Jeanette Robinson at a mutual friend's wedding reception. While on one of their first dates Smity took Jeanette to go shopping at the EJ Corvette Store, once they were at the store Smitty insisted that Jeanette get whatever she wanted... Jeanette ultimately told Smitty that she didn't see anything that intrigued her, Smitty was so amazed by her poise and modesty that he decided on that day she would be his wife. In 2003 Smitty joined Christian love Baptist church under the leadership of the late Reverend Ronald B. Christian and served as an ordained deacon before moving to his forever church home Mount Pleasant Missionary Baptist Church and served as a deacon under the leadership of Pastor Rakeem Thomas.

To know Deacon Smitty was truly to love him. Deacon Smitty was not a man to leave very much to the imagination regarding how he felt, and he would always be sure to let you know that he was coming from a place of love and concern. At any party or event, you can for sure count on Deacon Smitty to always be the first on the dance floor showing off his best moves and stylish ensembles. Dancing and dressing are two of the many things he will be remembered for.

Tuesday, November 23rd, 2021, Deacon Smitty transitioned from labor to reward as his work is now complete. Mount Pleasant has expressed that Deacon Smitty will be forever cherished, honored and appreciated for his love, his commitment, and his faithful service. He was truly a 5-star deacon and has completed a job well done.
