Obituary

Evangelist Charlie Jewerl Singletary was born in Wilcox County, GA on September 15th to the late Will Jackson and Pearlean Gibson later relocating to Passaic, NJ as a child where she was educated and lived until the Lord called her home.

Evangelist Singletary worked as a lamp shade seamstress, domestic worker, and a dietary aid at Chestnut Hill for years before becoming an entrepreneur with her husband.

On December 16, 1949 Evangelist Singletary married the love of her life Mr. Eugene “Pookey” Singletary and from that union came Renee Michelle Singletary.

In the early sixties Evangelist Singletary and Mr. Singletary opened up a luncheonette on Myrtle Ave. in Passaic, NJ affectionately known as “The Chippy Joint”. They also started a local band called “The Swinging Kings” who would go on to record records and tour the tri-state area.

Evangelist Singletary has always loved the Lord accepting Christ at an early age but in 1990 she gave him her complete yes and was ordained as an Evangelist by Bishop Delmon Lawson of Miracle Revival Church in Passaic, NJ.

She was a member of the Spiritual Way Baptist Church of Newark, NJ under the leadership of Reverend L.C. Redding for many years before becoming a member and church mother of the Faith Worship Center, CKMI under the leadership

of Reverend Larry McKenzie in Paterson, NJ.
