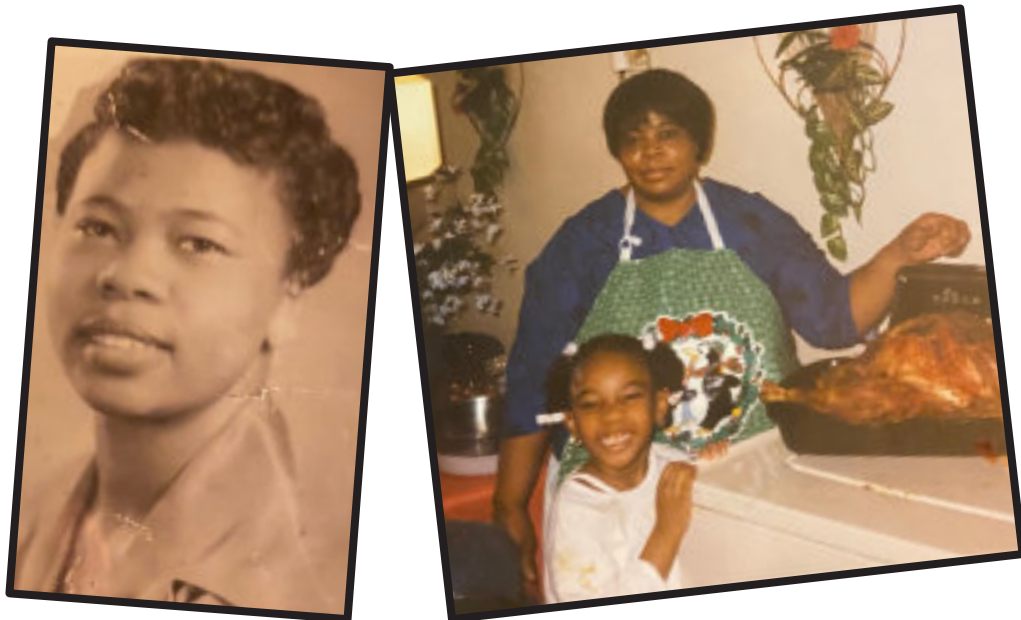
She worked as a switchboard operator at Linden General Hospital in Brooklyn, NY.
