## Obituary

On January 15, 2022, our Mom, **Mrs. Annie Dobson**, received her wings and went to walk with the angels at the age of 87 years old.

Our Mom will be remembered as a selfless individual who had a smile even when times were tough. There is nothing that Mom would not do for her family. She had a quiet strength. She never complained and looked to a better future. Her kindness was apparent in her everyday life. Her home was always open to family and friends. Mom was a great mother, grandmother, sister, aunt and friend. She loved her Faith Temple Baptist Church Family. She enjoyed attending the Dobson and Taylor Family

Reunions. She always brought and kept us together.

Mom had a great sense of humor and a wonderful sense of adventure; she was very independent and remained so until her health began to decline when she began suffering from dementia. She enjoyed traveling and loved the changing of the seasons; Spring and Autumn were her favorites. She especially enjoyed the changing of the leaves. Her favorite flower was Gladiolus.
