Linda has a very large family consisting of 4 children, 16 grandchildren, 15 great-grandchildren, and ten siblings. She also raised Jerell Edmonds, River Edmonds, Terrell Finley, and Kaleb Pujols.

God was very significant in Linda's life. She was a member and Missionary of Bible Way Tabernacle Church of Passaic, NJ, where she was also the Sunday School Teacher, Youth Counselor, and Jr. Choir Director.

She obtained a real estate license from Caldwell Banker, but her real passion was teaching. She graduated with honors from Passaic Community College with an associate degree in Early Childhood Education and was selected as Who's Who among her peers. She continued her education, graduating with honors from Springfield College, with a bachelor's degree and a master's degree in Early Childhood Education, then received her P3 Teaching Certification from Caldwell College.

Linda worked Real Estate Sales at Coldwell Banker, as a Pre School Teacher at New Bairn Jewish Synagogue, as Children's Care Coordinator at Passaic County 4C's, as a Pre School Teacher at Children's Day Nursery; she ultimately joined the Passaic Family Head Start on September 24, 1990. During her tenure at Head Start, she has taught hundreds of children. Every child remembers their favorite teacher. Linda was that for countless children. She was supportive of other teachers and assistants as well. Linda retired on June 13, 2017, and after retirement, she continued as a teacher at Nygeria Ark.

She was unforgettable to the more than 500 students she taught, and to her family, she was nothing short of a superhero.
