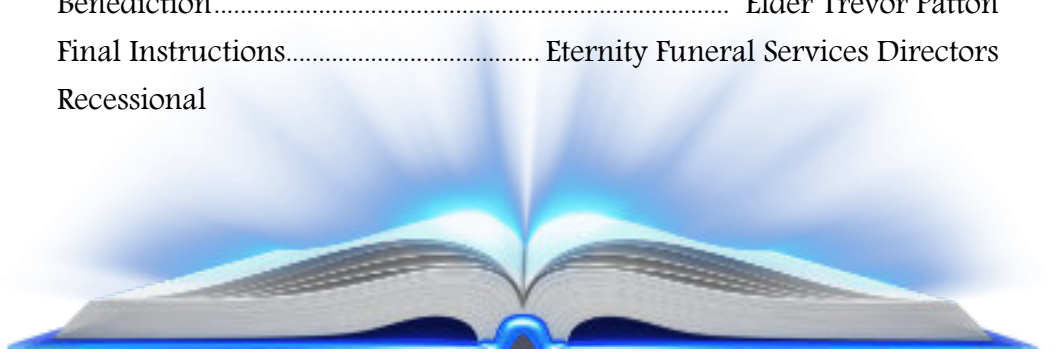

Obituary

Alfred Stewart was born the 5th of 8 children to Stanford and Bertina Stewart in the Longville District of Clarendon Jamaica. His early years were spent with his Grandmother. Following the death of his Grandmother, he moved to Effortville to live with his Parents. He was educated in Clarendon, Jamaica and went on to work for Caribbean Casting and Engineering. During this time, he lived with his sister, Rebecca in Central Village and commuted from May Pen.. During one of his trips, he met and fell in love with Leela Fearon, who lived in Effortville at the time. She was introduced to his first son, Courtney Anthony Stewart, before the two got married in 1982. Their marriage produced two children: daughter, Colleen Stewart, and son, Omar Stewart. Alfred was a strong believer in hard-work. He believed that it's by the sweat of your brow that you should eat bread. In 1987, Alfred immigrated to the United States to join his wife in their journey to seek a better life for the family. The two worked tirelessly to get their dream home, '945'. Wherever Alfred worked he exercised a work-ethic that was recognized and rewarded as the model worker. He was awarded for not missing a day of work in more than 20 years. He lived as he worked, towards perfection. He took pride in respect, and presentation for himself and his family. In 2014, he was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease.

His illness advanced rapidly shortly after diagnosis, leading to drastic challenges with mobility and communication. Throughout his sickness, he remained a strong and hard-worker, fighting this disease with every bit of strength. Alfred was nurtured and cared for, in the home he loved, 945, by the people he loved most. His smile was infectious, his energy was contagious and brought light to a dark room. He loved to share and was kind to a fault. He was given many nicknames by the people who he loved. Katt, Goose, Ricey, Stewey, Freddo, Tuney Man, Brownie, and his favorite, Hunny Bunny.

Alfred was born Thursday April 12th, 1951. On Thursday, January 6th, 2022, Alfred's fight was over. He will be buried today, Thursday, January 27th, 2022.

Alfred left to mourn his loss, his wife of 40 years, Leela Stewart. His Daughter, Colleen Stewart-White. His Son, Omar Stewart. His Grandsons, Elijah Stewart and Noah-Austin White and his Granddaughter, Brooke Leela-Ann White. His brothers: Walott and Romey, nieces, nephews, and a host of other relatives and friends. He was preceded by his Son, Courtney Anthony Stewart, Sisters: Leena, Rebecca, and Henrita and brother, Ephraim Stewart.

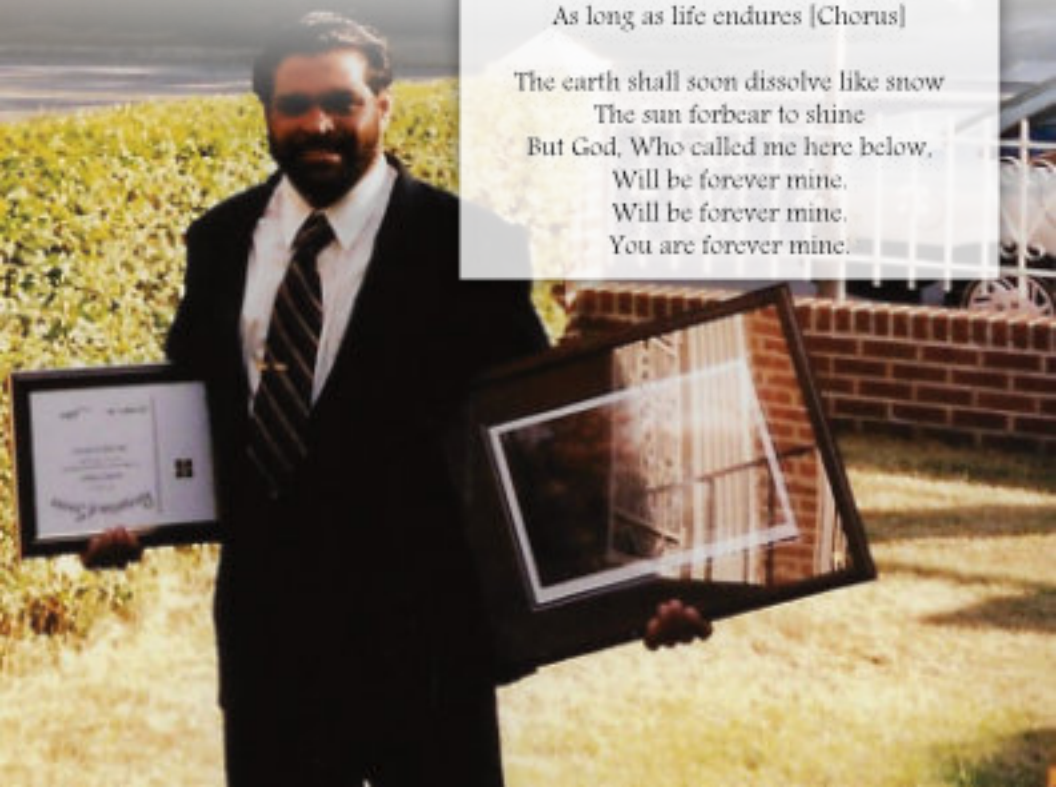
(My Chains are Gone)

Even for His own Name's sake. [Refrain]

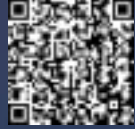
Yea, thou I walk in death's dark vale,
