The women were engaged in hospitality, ensuring local women's health, and organizing positive social gatherings for saddened families. She later met her husband, George, during her work, and both came together to raise a family of five children. They eventually moved to the United States where they settled in South Plainfield, NJ. Agnes was a member of Grace Episcopal Church then later the Anglican Church of the Messiah.

Agnes loved to entertain herself with sports and Korean daytime dramas. Her best times were when she was animated after a particular play whether it was a soccer match, tennis event, or even figure skating. She would mimic the athlete's play and style, regaling her family of their winning kick and nail-biting volleys. Roger Federer could do no wrong in her eyes and was her unofficial third son.

Agnes departed from this world on January 7, 2022. She leaves behind her husband George K. Intsiful and 5 children: Janet, Josephine, John, Benjamin, and Gina.
