Louis Eccleston Reid, son of Altemon Reid and Rebecca Hall, was born in the district of Old England in the parish of Manchester, Jamaica W.I. on May 29, 1935. Louis spent his early life there, but was later sent to live in Clarendon with two of his father's sisters, Lucille Samuels and Reberta Thompson. Louis attended school in Milk River, Clarendon. The story is that his aunts spoiled him **rotten!**. He got his first job at the famous Milk River Bath in Clarendon and worked there for several years.

In 1960, Louis left Clarendon and migrated to Birmingham, England. He found employment at Baker & Allen Steel Company as a machine operator for 5 years. Louis initially met the love of his life, Icelyn Morgan in 1965 at a rooming house in Birmingham. They briefly met one day in the kitchen and she gave him a short lesson in culinary skills because he had **none!**

Icelyn soon left that location but several months later they reconnected at a dance. They had a whirlwind romance, got engaged and 6 months later, a day after Icelyn's Birthday, March 26, 1966, they became husband and wife. This union produced no children and lasted 55 years until his untimely passing.

A year later they both relocated to the United States on an invitation from Louis' uncle, Louie Reid. In Harlem, N.Y., Louis reunited with his two aunts who raised him and remained close to them until their deaths. Louis found employment in the food service industry and then went to work at Kingsbridge Heights Nursing Home, Bronx, N.Y. for 25 years as a porter until his retirement on July 30, 1997.

The freedom of life, post retirement, allowed Louis to devote more time to his other passions like playing his vinyl records and cassettes. He was a movie aficionado and spent countless hours watching classic movies from the fifties and sixties. Louis loved nature and being outside. He enjoyed gardening and took great pride in his herb and vegetable gardens. You would also be impressed by the beautiful array of flowers. Louis was also a devoted fan of the New York Yankees and enjoyed watching baseball games and reciting sports facts.

Louis' amazing life and memory will always be revered lovingly by his wife, Icelyn, his adopted daughter, Julia Bridgewater & Family; His adopted son Lloyd Davis; His Brother – Lionel Reid. Sister-in-law Delores Robinson. Nephews - Denroy Robinson & Wife Fern, Brooks Robinson & Family; Cousins - Tony Samuels & wife Mildred. Nieces- Doreen Rose and son Jeremy, Mineve Carr and & Family. Louis will also be missed by numerous other relatives and friends.
