Saturday, January 15, 2022, Bennett Ludwig Milliner went home to be with the LORD.

Bennett, 78 years old, was the son of Ludwig Godfrey Milliner and Christina Evangeline Chinnery Milliner, born March 11, 1943 the 2nd of five children.

Bennett started school on St. Thomas, Virgin Islands before moving to Harlem, NY along with his mother and siblings Patsy, Romeo (deceased in 2020), Basil and Godfrey. His father relocated to New York in 1952 to prepare for his family's arrival in 1953. Bennett attended PS68 and Cooper JHS and left school in the 9th grade. He was blessed to get a job as a Printer Apprentice and became a Unionized Printer which he loved until he retired in 1998.

As a child, he enjoyed playing jokes and taking apart things to see what made them work. Bennett had a few nicknames depending on who you speak with. He was known as Benny, Bun, because of the scar he had on his head that he got from playing in the kitchen and Benny the Blood from being a gang member in the 50's in Harlem.

Bennett believed in Black Culture and was a supporter of the Soap Box Preachers on 125 Street on 7th Ave in Harlem during the late 50's into the 60's such as: Malcolm X, Adam Clayton Powell Jr, Martin Luther King Jr and others who spoke in Harlem at that time.

Bennett loved to party and was a good dancer. He enjoyed playing his favorite music (especially his LP's) which he called Soul Music. The Temptations, Isley Brothers, Sam Cooke, James Brown and others loudly till the wee hours of the morning.

Bennett was a loving and loyal son, father, brother, uncle and friend. He would take his son and nephews to ball games and wrestling matches. When his brother Romeo was diagnosed with kidney disease, he donated a kidney which lasted 31 years until his untimely passing in 2020. He was fiercely protective of the women in his family. Whenever they brought someone new around he would inquire, "WHAT ARE YOUR INTENTIONS!?"

Bennett married Pat Moore March 15, 1964 and they had one son, Bennett Milliner Jr. who drowned in 1984 in a swimming accident. After their divorced, he met and married Deloris Adams in 1981 and had another son Chad Milliner.

As he aged, he enjoyed watching sports discussing politics and other current events.

Unfortunately many years of bad habits led to kidney failure that caused him to have to take Dialysis 3 times a week on top of his diabetes which already took a toll on his body. This led to him being hospitalized quite often and needing Home Care, which his brother Basil took on, and therefore built a stronger bond of love and friendship until his death.

He was preceded in death by; Parents, Ludwig & Christina, Step-Mother Panceita Milliner. Son: Bennett Milliner Jr, Brothers: Romeo Milliner & Kevin Frett.
