The Celebrator-Wherever she was, that is where the party was! She loved to celebrate with family and friends. Whether it was throwing house parties back in the day, going to clubs, promoting parties as Bronx Nita, or even hosting family cookouts and reunions; she was the one to make sure everyone would have a good time. She would gather everyone in her van, bus or whatever, but more importantly she gathered everyone in heart.

The Aunt & Grandmother-Anita was revered as the Matriarch of the

family and was loved and respected as such. She is known as Aunt Nita and Gramps to those that are technically her cousins. She was the place of safety that always kept her home open. Whether you needed a place to stay, a shoulder to cry on, a plate of food, toiletries for your house; no matter what it is, she had it! Preparing food was her way of showing love. She made sure that no one around her was hungry and if you were blessed enough to have her cooking, then you felt the love. She gathered her family once a week to enjoy a meal and spend time together. She also encouraged other families to do the same. Her grandchildren and great grandchildren adored her. She would have special time with them individually and collectively. From walks to get ice creams, playing games, cooking them special dishes, she always made a way to show them that they mattered and was loved.

The Counselor-Anita was extremely grateful to God for her life. This made it easier to share her testimony with others allowing her to be a confidant as well as a counselor. She always had time to listen and provide advice (whether you agreed or not). She had a spiritual gift that would sometimes frighten her. Anita would tell you what was going to happen before it happened. She started to send her daily text messages, prayers, and scriptures to encourage and motivate all. Once again, showing others that they mattered.

The Worker-From a little girl, Anita wanted to make sure she had some money and had very creative ways of insuring that she and her family did not go without. She has been a driver for over 30 years. Initially driving the mentally challenged and later a school bus driver. She took her matrons under a wing and made a lasting impression on her coworkers.

She has touched the lives of so many people across multiple generations. A true giver to the homeless and everyone. There will never be another!

Anita Cabello is survived by her mother, Gloria Cabello, her two sisters Paula and Gloria, brother-in-law, George, her daughters, Sabrina and Juanita, her son in laws, Darnell and Lawrence, bonus children, Pavon and Wynter, her grandchildren, Dwayne and his wife, Asia, David, Sabrina, Lauren, Lance, her great- grandchildren, Dwayne Jr, Ariah, David Jr, Dylan and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and loved ones.
