Obituary

She could make you laugh with a simple “get outta here.” She particularly enjoyed Sunday’s gospel program, people watching or just taking in the sights. Simple things, a bus up and down the streets of NYC was something to do for her as she got older. When she could, she walked all over NYC and would come back and brag that she had just walked from 42nd Street back uptown to 114th Street. She had a fashion sense and would put those freshly pressed clothes on straight out of the cleaners including her t-shirts. Clarence and Timothy would like to acknowledge Jocelyn Nixon for the exemplary care that she provided our mother both as a caregiver and companion, for 5 plus years. Many thanks to the home health aides who contributed their time to help care for “Momma” as they all called her. Without you she would not have lived to see the golden age of 100 as we were so fortunate to have seen and shared with her. So again, Miss Jocelyn, we thank you for all that you did for our mother Christine. Out of all our

mother's friends, Ms. Margaret held a special place in Momma's heart as one of her oldest and dearest friends.

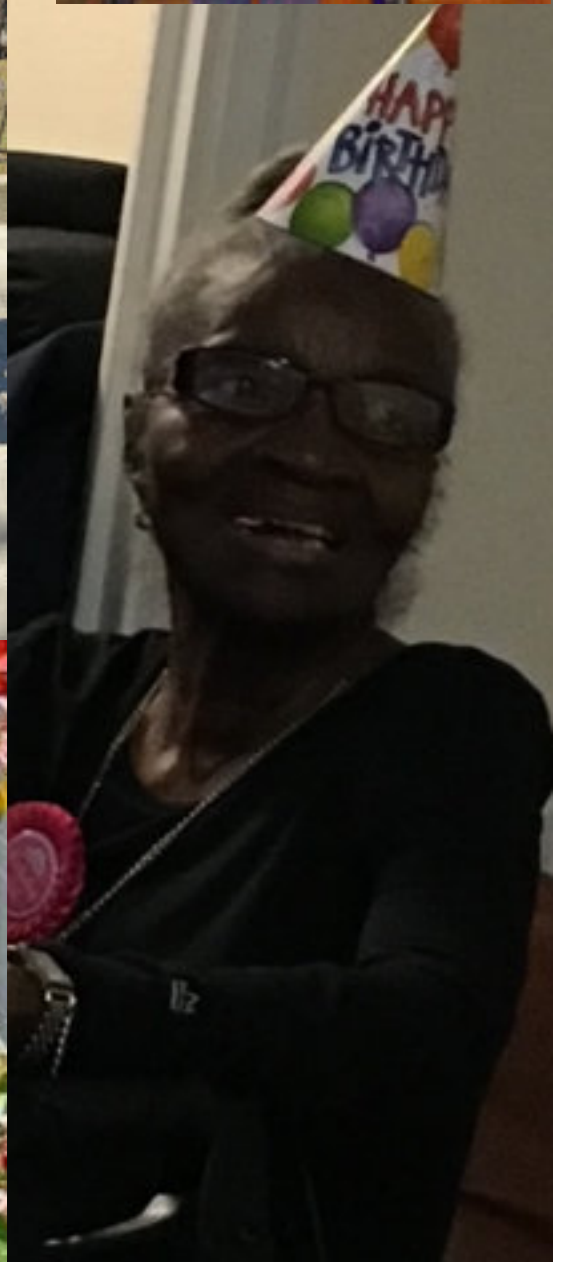


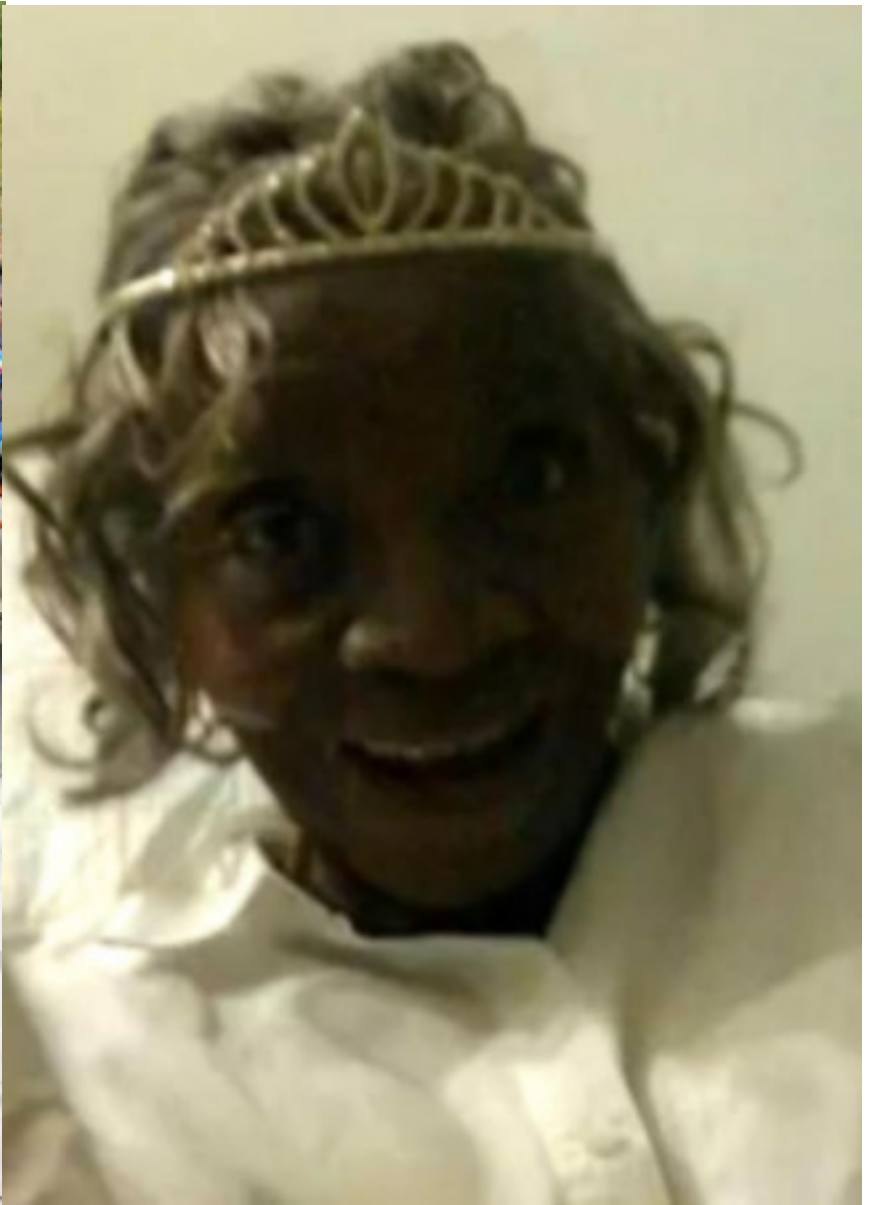
