However on one faithful day in 1968 while attending a social function with friends her life would change

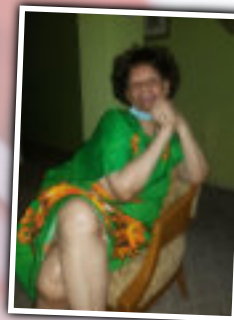
