Obituary

On January 26, 2022 Jesus extended his hand to **Georgetta White** and said “Well done thou good and faithful servant”.

Georgetta White, born February 14, 1931, was the ninth of thirteen children of the late John Harding and Elizabeth Wells Harding in Pleasant Hill, North Carolina. Georgetta, who was affectionately known as “Little-Bit”, graduated from Gumberry High School in North Hampton County. As a young girl she accepted God as her Lord and Savior and was a member of the Faithful Band Missionary Baptist Church in Pleasant Hill, North Carolina. After graduating High School, Georgetta moved to Charlotte, North Carolina, and attended The Morgan Beauty School. Upon receiving her certification, Georgetta relocated to Baltimore, Maryland, where she met the love of her life, Arthur White. On January 16, 1960, after a six month courtship, Georgetta and Arthur were married. In 1962, they moved to Brooklyn, New York, and soon after joined the Mt. Sinai Baptist Church. Georgetta remained a faithful member until her untimely death. In 1965, their only child, Jennifer, was born.

Georgetta exhibited her skills as a hairdresser by doing several women and girls hair in the building where she lived. She was the lady to see if you wanted the old school “press and curl”. Georgetta also worked as a School Aide with the New York City Board of Education for over 25 years and retired at the young age of 81.

Georgetta was a devoted Christian who loved the lord and was in God’s house every Sunday (weather permitting). She attended Sunday School, Bible Study, and was a member of the Tribe of Joseph. Every year in August, she would travel back to North Carolina to attend THE HARDING FAMILY REUNION.

What she loved was God, family, baseball, and shopping. Georgetta was a serious Mets fan win or lose, but she was also serious about shopping. She would spend hours inside of Macy’s shopping for herself and for others.

Although small in stature, she had no problem speaking her mind. She would let you know “I’m only telling you the truth because I love you”.

Georgetta was preceded in death by her husband of 58 years, Arthur White, her siblings: Veoria Harding Sykes, Inez Harding Banks, Irma Harding Robinson, Lola Harding Ferguson, Arby Harding Johnson, John Harding, her twin brother George Harding, Thelma Harding Jefferson, Kermit Harding, and Willie Harding. She leaves to cherish her memory, her daughter Jennifer, son-in-law Jeffery, “grand-daughter Samia”, grandson Jawaan, sisters Martha Harding Scott of New York City, Dozine Harding Hampton of North Carolina, sister-in-law Marie Harding of Richmond, Virginia, and a host of nieces, nephews, and friends.

Georgetta will be laid to rest next to her husband at Cypress Hill Cemetery in Brooklyn.
