Dr. Joe Chukwudi Udeze was born in Aba, Eastern Nigeria on October 23, 1946, to Mr. and Mrs. Anthony and Beatrice Udeze Iloagbaonwu of Umuoma, Utuh village in Nnewi South LGA, Anambra State. He was the fourth of seven children.

Affectionately called Obi-Adi'we (one who never harbors a grudge or gets angry) by his mother, Joe lived his life by that title. He was a handsome man with a heart of gold. His quiet, yet powerfully positive presence was a gift to anyone he came across. He never met a stranger.

His parents vowed to make sure that their children would be educated, and Joe took that commitment to heart. A devout Catholic, he began his educational journey at Christ the King School and then went on Sacred Heart College; both in Aba. Upon graduation, he worked in the insurance industry as an agent for Royal Exchange Assurance.

In the late 60s, Joe was recruited in the military during the Nigerian civil war. He served as a Signal Officer attached to the Second Division of the Nigerian army based at Nnewi.

1971 proved to be a life changing year for Joe. He left Nigeria at the invitation of his senior brother, Clement, who secured admission for him and his junior brother Donatus to attend university in the United States. With a focus on maximizing his education, Joe graduated in 1974 with a degree in Biology from the University of Minnesota-Duluth. He went on to pursue graduate education in Endocrinology at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. His passion for the sciences grew and he was admitted to St. George's University, School of Medicine in Grenada, on a scholarship from the Nigerian Federal Government. Joe graduated as a medical doctor in 1987. He went on to specialize in Infectious Disease at Cabrini and Beekman Downtown Hospitals in New York.

During his medical training, Joe spent a considerable amount of time in New York. It was there, at 1459 Carrol St, that he met his "Beloved", Norma Grant. They shared many years of life, love, family and community in Brooklyn, New York.

"Dr. Joe", as he was fondly called by his friends and neighbors, was a welcoming presence in the neighborhood. He would often be found happily chatting with everyone about current events, the latest sporting event or what happened at school that day. He was part of the fabric of his community. When he fell ill, his neighbors were right by his side.

Joe loved life. His generosity knew no bounds. Whatever he had, he shared with others. He adored his entire family and had a soft spot for his sisters, Christiana, Carol and Louisa. He was a faithful Catholic, attending St. Francis of Assisi-St. Blaise Catholic Church for many decades. He was fond of cooking and his recipes strongly reflected the Nigerian cuisine he grew up with. His eyes would light up and his spirit soared whenever good music was playing. At one point, during the Nigerian Civil war, he helped facilitate the musical entertainment of the soldiers. Joe also loved sports. He immensely enjoyed playing tennis; and played with his brothers often as they grew up together, and later with his friends and colleagues. He was an avid soccer fan and player. He played for Enyimba Soccer club of Aba and for Jeno Paulucci's soccer club in Duluth, MN.

An active and founding member of Utuh, USA Incorporated, Joe never forgot home. He understood the importance of community and giving back to others.

On January 4, 2022, Dr. Joseph Chukwudi Udeze made his final journey. He spent his last days being loved and cared for by his family.


Rest well, Obi-Adi'we. Your heart was like no other. Well done.

Thanks to our neighbor George Javana who was always available to help in critical situations.

Dr. Joe was a pleasant and joyful neighborhood presence who will be greatly missed. We shall not see his like again.
