Obituary

He also had an extensive vinyl record collection. He was a self-taught carpenter, and built floor to ceiling bookcases, closets, and many other things in his lifetime.

Ray is survived by his wife, Bevelynn Tucker, Bronx, New York; daughters, Diana Tucker Figueroa (Richard Figueroa) New York, Chimene Tucker, Los Angeles, and Shameka Go; sisters-in-law and brothers-in-law; nieces and nephews, and a host of other relatives and friends.
