Anthony Charles Yearwood, Jr. entered this World on Sunday, August 20th, 1989 born in New York City to Anthony Charles Yearwood, Sr. (Tony) and Stephanie Hughes.

Anthony received his education at Our Lady of Lourdes from 1994-1997; The New York City Public School System from 1997-2007. Anthony furthered his education at Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, AL, from 2007-2009 and then attended Technical Career Institute in New York, NY, from 2010-2011. During his teenage years, he was employed at daycare centers and after school programs throughout the boroughs, even as far as Upstate New York, were he was a Junior Counselor at Camp Eureka, Roscoe, New York. As an adult, Anthony was employed with The New York City Police Department School Safety Division in 2012 until his death.

Anthony was also studying to take the real estate license exam to become a licensed realtor in New York this February.

Anthony was lovingly dubbed a "gentle giant". Anthony stood firm on his beliefs while also making sure those around him were cared for. He was a multifaceted man with an active and diverse past. Anthony enjoyed sports as well as spending memorable times with friends, family, and loved ones. He participated on his high school football team, the John Adams Spartans and won the 2019 Flag Football Championship while participating in the NYPD School Safely Division Athletic League.
