Ilfane Isac's journey started in Grande Rivière, Jacmel, Haiti. She was raised by her stepmom/Godmother Arianne and did not have many memories of her mother who passed away when she was 3 years old. Her father was a middle class farmer who loved his children, He had a total of 19 kids with Ilfane being the 4th out of 8 daughters and 11 sons. Ilfane and her siblings were fortunate enough to be raised together in the same house until adulthood where everyone parted ways. Ilfane was very smart from a young age. She graduated high school as the valedictorian and went on to become a nurse. At 22 she was one of the top students in her class to pass the nursing exam but was disqualified from continuing her education when her school found out she was expecting.

Ilfane left Jacmel and went to Port-au-prince to start a better life. She found a warehouse job as a seamstress but knew she wanted more for herself. She then started her own restaurant to make more money and feed the community Her business was a success and provided her money to buy her land and build a house of her own. In the 1990's she left Haiti and came to the USA to pursue an even better life. She always dreamed of becoming a teacher when she arrived to the US but was unable to due to time. Instead life made her a teacher of many spreading her wisdom to those around her.

Ilfane was a mother of 2 to her eldest son Ronald and youngest son Sony. She was a very devote catholic Woman who loved to sing and had a lovely voice but never pursued singing as a career. When she was in Haiti she was apart of the community outreach missions and prayed over many. She only married and divorced once and was able to enter half of her family into the US to have a chance at a better life.

Ilfane can be described as a caring, forgiving strict, focused, courageous, independent, go-getter, funny and most times inappropriate woman. She was someone you knew not to mess with because she would put you in your place. She has always been a woman of her word and stood by her principles. She loved to travel and refused to sit still. She loved her family, going to church, senior center activities, thrifting, and food pantry trips with her grandchildren. These were the highlights of her day and kept her going. One of the strongest marks she left behind was ensuring that her grandkids and everyone around her was prepared with life and survival skills from cooking, to sewing and lots more.

On February 1, 2022 she was called home leaving her loved ones with nothing but wisdom, love and plenty of memories. She will finally reunite with her parents, those who raised her, 4 sisters, 3 brothers, many friends, and loved ones she has waited long to see.

Ilfane will be loved and missed. her legacy will forever live on through 8 siblings: Emily,Michelin, Raymond,Michelle, Nemours, Camille, Victor, Clermont. 7 nephews and nieces: Jacques, Patrick, Williamson, Jackson, Rachel , Darling, and Ginette. 2 sons: Ronald and Sony. 2 daughter in laws: Rose & Carline. 8 grandchildren: Richard, Lovely , Woosvelt, Dominique, Stanley, Carine, Kervens and Chloe. And 6 great grandchildren Ashley, Jeremiah , Justin, Danny, Jordan & Saif.
