<u>Obituary</u>

Herman Samuels, the youngest of 11 children of proud parents Alonzo Samuels and Bertha Samuels, n'ee Lett was born of July 24, 1922 in Pollard Alabama.

When Herman turned 18 years of age, he desired to venture out and move from the small rural town of Pollard Alabama without informing his parents (because such would have broke his parents heart -especially his mother who would've had him experiencing a feeling of guilt for wanting to leave). Herman was the last of his 10 siblings to eventually depart from his parents humble abode in Pollard; just as each of his elder siblings had systemically done throughout the foregoing years.

When Herman arrived in Mobile Alabama where one of his older brother's Robido was residing, he telephoned his parents and apprised them that he was safe and was now living with his older sibling and family. During the 3 years that Herman lived in Mobile Alabama, he was able to secure a few menial jobs, being that the United States was entering into World War II and was fortunate that he was skilled in the trade of carpentry.

In 1943, when Herman was 21 years of age he decided to join most of his other elder siblings Lafayette, Daisy, Cleophuis, Voncille, Bennett and Gifford and move North to New York City.

Upon arriving in NYC, Herman was employed in a variety means of employment, one initially being a box manufacturer in 1944 for The Famous Paper Box Company and ultimately becoming a professional waxer for The Madison Cleaning Company in 1946. Which resulted in Herman becoming a member of (32BJ) the union for Building & Janitors for 41 years; until his retirement in 1987 at age 65.

Herman Samuels joined Metropolitan Baptist Church in 1943 under Reverend Abner Brown. He was a devout christian and attended church faithfully every Sunday.

Herman was the chairman for the Male Usher Board for several decades and was responsible for organizing very successful fundraisers commencing in 1955 (ie bus rides) for Metropolitan.

Herman loved being a very long standing elder of Metropolitan as he experienced as well as endured the several transitional changes of pastors throughout the 7 decades of his membership.

Herman met, courted and married Edna Mae DeVette and from this union a son Herman Alonzo Samuels was born on November 30, 1948. Unfortunately, Herman and Edna Mae divorced in 1964.

Subsequently, Herman met Catherine (sister) Drake on a fundraiser bus ride for Metropolitan Baptist Church and they were both introduced to one another by a fellow usher of the church Willie (Doc) Drake (Catherine's eldest brother). Herman and Catherine thereafter engaged in several social activities which ultimately led to engagement and then matrimony on Catherine's birthday December 11, 1965. To this union a son Alvin K. Samuels was born on December 28, 1967. Herman & Catherine remained fittingly married until her return to the essence in 2003.

Herman transitioned unto his peaceful journey on the early morning of February 3, 2022. Herman departed this earth in the physical sense at the age of 99, and was only 5 months shy of his 100th birthday. He was very proud of his independence, that he never required any assistant or a home health aide, and traveled alone as well as could tend to all his errands for himself.

Herman was very blessed with longevity, he was widower and the last survivor of all his 10 siblings, his wife Catherine (Drake) Samuels of 37 years and all of his brothers and sisters preceded him in death.

Herman leaves to cherish his memory; two sons Herman A.Samuels and Alvin K. Samuels, three grandchildren Jamar Samuels from San Antonio Texas, Savoirfaire J. Samuels and Qu't'eion C. Samuels, seven great grandchildren, six great grandchildren; nephew Mr & Mrs Robert (Nin) Samuels from Mobile Alabama, grand nieces Gwendolyn Samuels and Regina Johnson, great grand niece VaRhonda Johnson, sister in law by marriage Mrs Willie Webb, n'ee Drake and female companion Ms Amelia Scarborough, many many more extended family members to extensive to name and many many friends and fellow church parishioners.
