Shirley Bell departed this life on Sunday May 1, 2022, with daughter Shariah by her side. Shirley was born on February 2, 1966 in Newark, New Jersey.

She graduated from Weequahic High School, attended Essex County College and earned an accredited degree in Theology - while still a teenager - from Bethel Bible Institute in Queens, New York. She flourished and rose the ranks in any field, whether it be retail, the music industry, college admissions and most recently, real estate home sales. Shirley especially excelled in the music industry. Shirley's career path began in the music industry! She spent over 10 years as a valued professional with Flavor Unit Entertainment which originally launched in Jersey City, New Jersey before the companies relocation to Miami Florida.

During Shirley's early professional career path she was catapulted as the Head of A&R to prominent platinum musical recording artist that climbed the Billboard charts. The Platinum Artist included Apache, Monica, Naughy By Nature and most

notably Queen Latifah! After many years of Shirley's success in expanding Flavor Unit Entertainment growth, Shirley sought Entrepreneurship in the music business and SB Entertainment was founded exclusively by Shirley during the late 1998-2000 years. Shirley strategically launched and managed the musical solo careers of CoKo formally lead singer of the R&B vocal trio group Sisters With Voices, SWV. She later was instrumental in managing the solo career of Faith Evans Wife of The Notorious B.I.G., Biggie Smalls.

Despite her professional expansion and success in the entertainment industry, Shirley changed her professional path and pursued a new path in the education relm. After serving as an assistant director at Gibbs Business school Shirley accepted a great opportunity to serve as the Director of Admissions at Eastern International College at Belleville and Jersey City Locations.

Shirley became a Christian during her early childhood. Her mother ensured her children attendance in Sunday school and church weekly. She attended and was a member of Soul-Saving Station, Ebenezer Gospel Tabernacle, Genesis Temple COGIC and Emmanuel A.M.E. She had a calling and prophesied the Word as told and guest-preached in various Houses of God when asked. An amazing friend, cousin, niece, aunt and sister, honoring her mother and father came second only to raising her children in the way they should go. Her loyalty to her children and those she loved came first.

The Lord made her classy, with none feeling less-than. The Lord made her counsel for many, yet with no judgment. The Lord made her generous, with no expectations of return. 
