## <u>Obituary</u>

Michael Anthony Noel was born on November 21, 1950 in Brooklyn, NY to the late Lennox Gill Noel and Leonora McEwen Noel. He was the youngest of their three children.

At age six, Mike began his elementary school education, in Harlem, at Resurrection Catholic School. After his graduation in June 1964, he began his freshman year at Cardinal Hayes High School. As Mike prepared to begin his sophomore semester classes, the family suffered the unexpected loss of their mother. Concerned about Mike's education, his father agreed to enroll Mike at Laurinburg Institute in North Carolina. Mike transferred to Laurinburg in January 1966. He graduated in June 1969 as Valedictorian, earning a scholarship to attend the college of his choice. Mike was accepted at Howard University (Washington, DC) and graduated with his Bachelor of Business Administration degree in December 1973. Shortly after graduation, Mike joined Wausau Insurance for training in Wisconsin.

After completing claims adjustment training, he joined the Washington, DC office for several years. Unfortunately, the work was not fulfilling enough. After speaking with his uncle about a travel job, he applied for his U.S. Merchant Seaman License. Within a month, he was assigned to a merchant ship; he loved the work, the income and the travel. For several years, his work took him to various global locations including: Australia, New Zealand, Antarctica, Indonesia, Hong Kong, Japan, China, India, the Middle East, South Africa, West Africa, East Africa, Germany and England.

Mike returned to the New York area in the mid-1980s, where he met and later married Arlene Rogers in 1987. A few months later, they relocated to El Paso, Texas with her young daughter, Dominique, until Spring 1988. Later in 1988, they returned to New York State and a daughter, Michelle (who predeceased Mike in 2014), was born later that year.

After his divorce from Arlene in 1997, he was recruited by Volunteers of America, given his extensive international travel experience, to manage special traveler programs at JFK and LaGuardia Airports. He enjoyed the work and the travelers he assisted. In 2014, he was diagnosed with kidney failure and placed on disability since he required dialysis several times a week. By October 2021, a compatible kidney match was found and the transplant operation was successful. He no longer required dialysis. In late April 2022, he was being assessed for cardiac issues and was scheduled for medical follow-up at the time of his death.
