Rudolph Valentino Roundtree Jr. "Rudy" was born on August 16, 1961 in Fayetteville, North Carolina. He was preceded in death by his parents Rudolph Roundtree Sr., Delores Sykes, William Sykes, Beulah Easterling, and Father-in-law Horace Jones, his siblings Jeannie Roundtree, Angela Roundtree, Matthew Roundtree and Shawn Roundtree, and by his son Rumeal Roundtree.

Rudy grew up in Newark, New Jersey where he attended Morton Street Elementary School and later graduated from Irvington High School in 1980. Rudy was an avid sports fan and especially loved baseball and basketball. During his academic years, Rudy enjoyed participating in school sports. For many years, he played baseball, where he received recognition through awards, an accumulation of trophies and other accolades. Rudy had a love for spending time with his family and friends and was the best host during holidays and celebrations. He had a well-kept secret of being a talented cook and could be found in the kitchen during the holidays showing others how to season and sauté. Rudy's laugh was infectious and his sense of humor unmatched. He had a way about him that put people at ease.

Work ethic and responsibility were integral parts of Rudy's personality, and he was both hardworking and ambitious. He worked for Cablevision where he met and married the love of his life Sheila Evans-Roundtree. He later took on a career path with ExxonMobil Chemical Company where he worked for 20 years. When not working for ExxonMobil, Rudy would spend a great deal of his time volunteering. Rudy truly believed in community, and service to that community. His value of community could easily be seen in how he interacted with others and the time he dedicated to giving back to the neighborhood he called home. In 2013, Rudy explored his passion further through a volunteer coaching career. He worked at a number of schools including at Arts High School of Newark. He also coached, supported and participated in parent leadership with Sports U Team IZOD where Rudy took on many integral roles that helped make the program a national success. Many of the players touched by Rudy have matriculated as college, International and NBA players. Rudy was also noted as a parent leader at Roselle Catholic where he worked with many of the student athletes. His special relationship as a friend and guardian to Nazreon Reid and Peace Ilegomah was instrumental as a mentor and Naz and Peace often recognize the impact Rudy had and will always have on their lives.
