




Granny ~ From grandchildren~

Reflections of Life

Rev. Dr. Ethel M. Bland was born July 7, 1925. She was the daughter of the late Bishop Albert and Grace Almeta Bland of Englewood, NJ.

> She attended and graduated from Westwood High School. She went on to nursing school, where she received her Licensed Practical Nursing degree. She was employed at the Bergen Pines Regional Hospital in Paramus, New Jersey for 27 years before retiring.

Rev. Dr. Ethel Bland answered the call of God to preach and teach the gospel and she never wavered from the calling.

Rev. Dr. Ethel Bland joined the Unity Missionary Church under the leadership of her father in 1957. She was one of the founding members. She devoted many years of her life to the faithful service of ministering, teaching and counseling Christian principles. She was a Bible class teacher since 1969. She was licensed in 1972 at Unity Missionary Church and ordained in 1977. In 1999 she received her Doctorate of Divinity degree from Shiloh Theological Seminary, Stamford, Virginia.

Rev. Dr. Ethel Bland was the founder of Christian Women United for Christ Association of Englewood, NJ in 1988. She became the fourth Pastor of Unity Missionary Church serving from 1999 - 2022. All who followed Rev. Dr. Ethel Bland knew her to be a powerful, mighty preacher, inspired and devoted teacher, and a strong believer in the power of prayer.

She attended The Hawthorne Bible School, Hawthorne, New Jersey. She also attended the Ambassador College, Pasadena, California, The Calvary Grace Bible Institute, Pennsylvania, PA, Eagles Nest Bible School, Dallas, Texas, The Unity Missionary Evangelist and Gifts Class, under the leadership of the Late Bishop Albert Bland, and worked along with the Rev. Billy Graham as counselor in New York City and New Jersey. She was a graduate of Christian United Institute and Seminary in New York, she was a member of the Ecumenical Bible Group of Teaneck, NJ.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by one sister Katherine Cooper-Brinson.

On Sunday, June 5, 2022 (Pentecost Sunday) after a lifetime of service, Pastor Ethel M. Bland departed this life and entered eternal rest at her home.

She leaves to remember wonderful and precious memories her one daughter Rev. Dr. Ethel Crews, two granddaughters Carla Shields and Stephanie Stehl, 4 great grandchildren, 20 great-great grandchildren, 1 great-great-great grandson, her devoted sister, Beatrice Truesdale, nieces, nephews, other family members, friends and the Unity Misisonary church family who will miss her dearly.
