Obituary

As a lifelong learner, Beverly continued her studies at Essex County College where she studied real estate and appraisal. Upon graduation, she and Joseph Johnson opened a small real estate company in East Orange, NJ called AquaViet Realty.

In addition, over the course of her career Beverly worked for the City of Newark, in various capacities with the Department of Parks and Grounds, and the Department of Housing. She also worked for the Essex County Tax Assessor's office using her background in real estate appraisal.

Beverly was a New Jersey resident who enjoyed local, domestic, and international politics. Most of her life, she was a resident of Essex County where she raised her family and resided in Montclair until her passing.
