Obituary

Jayne Peggy Cobb was born on February 28, 1956 to Doristine Rountree Cobb and Nelson Cobb, Sr. in Tyner, North Carolina. Jayne who was often referred to as Peggy was the fourth of eleven siblings.

At a young age Peggy along with her parents relocated to Newark, New Jersey where she was raised and grew up. As a youth she attended Oliver Street Elementary school, and thereafter she went onto graduate from East Side High School with the class of 1974. After graduating high school Peggy continued to pursue her education at Kean College where she majored in English. Peggy’s two daughters were the joy of her heart; she loved them most dearly, and devoted most of her life to raising and taking good care of them. She always made her two daughters her utmost first priority; and it showed through the love and care that she gave them as their mother; for they were truly the love of her life.

In 2010, Peggy became the proud grandma of a beautiful grandson, Ta’Shawn, whom she also loved dearly with all her heart, and every chance that was given to her, she would make it her business to spoil him unconditionally; in return Ta’Shawn loved and adored her even that much more.
