Eric Milton Parchment's dawn began on February 18th, 1940 in Colon, Panama following the union of Arthur Parchment and Sylvia Hoy. He was one of several children, some of whom resided in Colon, Panama and Columbia. Early on he had a love for music. As the Doo Wop craze swept the scene, he and four others formed the group the 5 Waves. They had great local success touring the Colon and Panama City night clubs. It was this music scene that led him to his future wife, Ivonne Elliott, who was also a singer in a female trio. The two would later wed on March 2nd, 1963 and their union would produce 2 children Ken and Nyoka.

Early Years

Eventually Eric left Panama for New York City in search of greater opportunity. He found work at a clothing firm on 34th street called Romans. His work ethic so impressed the owner Mr. Roman that he was appointed head of the inventory department. That position allowed his innovative and natural organizational skills to blossom.

Over time he rose from head of inventory to Vice President of that and several other divisions. His leisure time was spent visiting the Apollo theatre where he saw the top acts of the early 60's collecting autographs as he did so.


Later Years
