### **Obituary**

David Joseph Raymond Sr. was born on Friday, April 8, 1960 in Port of Spain, Trinidad. He was the fifth of eight siblings, born to Winifred Agnes Raymond and Joseph Gordon Raymond. In his childhood years, David attended Eastern Christian Catholic School (EC School) in Curepe, Trinidad West Indies from 1965 until 1969. He also attended Richmond Boy's School of Port of Spain, Trinidad for a few months before moving to the States.

After moving to the United States, on May 1, 1969, he then attended Public school 262 (PS 262) on Macon Street, in Bedford Stuyvesant, Brooklyn New York from 1969 through 1971. Consecutively he attended public school number two (PS #2) in Paterson, New Jersey from 1971 through 1975.

After which he attended high school from 1975 through 1979, at Passaic County Technical and Vocational High School in Wayne, New Jersey. He joined the US Navy in 1989, serving in the Gulf War and eventually being discharged in 1992. He graduated with honors with an electrical degree from DeVry University in 1998. He worked a variety of jobs in the electrical field as well as culinary arts.

He married Sylvia Turner in 1981 and had six children, two of which he adopted as his own. Later, he had Joseph Raymond with Lynette Scruge in 1997.

After finishing his term in the Navy, David lived in Florida for ten years, eventually coming back to New Jersey where he resided until his passing.

Joanne says no matter what the conversation entailed David always ended up on Jehovah. Virginia remembers David always dressing to the T. He always had a feather in his cap.
