Obituary

Edna was born on July 20, 1922, to Charles Radcliffe and Louisa Patrick Radcliffe in Victoria de Las Tunas, Cuba after her parents immigrated there in 1918 from Jamaica. Edna was the second of five children born to Charles and Louisa Radcliffe.

Upon the death of her father, the family continued to live in Cuba. Louisa along with the children managed the farm. Louisa later gave birth to Victor. Louisa, now raising 6 children, had to move to Jamaica as it was too difficult to stay in Cuba. When the family arrived in Jamaica, Edna only spoke Spanish. Within a year she quickly grasped English and continued her schooling in Jamaica. She later became a teacher at a primary school in Clarendon.

Edna later immigrated to the United States in 1945. She lived for many years with her Aunt Mabel and attended school. She delightfully tells of her brief time in Manhattan when she wanted to be an actress. Uncertain about what the future would hold, Edna returned to Jamaica and married Ansel Barrett. They owned and operated a furniture store for a few years. After a brief marriage, they divorced. This union produced no children. She once joked that was the reason she lived so long - no husband and no children.

Upon returning to the United States, she later decided on a stable career as a Hospital Dietician and later Supervisor. Edna worked at St. Barnabas Hospital for years.

Aunt Edna for as long as we knew her, lived on Grant Avenue. She never wanted to come to Florida and rarely visited. She once told us that everyone she knows who moves to Florida dies. Aunt Edna was very independent and had a daily routine that surely worked for her. Everyone says she was very classy and always well-dressed in her pantsuits. Aunt Edna enjoyed talking about politics and all of the latest news and happenings in New York. She kept up to date by watching television or listening to the radio.

Her siblings Sydney, Keith, Evelyn, Lorenzo, and Victor preceded her in death.

She leaves behind nieces and nephews, other relatives, and friends.

Aunt Edna, we will miss those long conversations. May the peace of the LORD always be with you.
