Beverly Ann Randolph was born on June 2, 1945 in Wilmington, North Carolina. She was the daughter of Gazzie B. Wells-Mariner and Jasper Solomon Wells. She was raised in a faith-filled and God-fearing family. She was affectionately known to many as "Bev" and to her family she was known as "Mom," "Aunt Bev," and "Grammie."

Beverly attended Little Williston Primary Schools in Wilmington, North Carolina before migrating to New Jersey where she graduated from East Rutherford High School. Beverly was an exceptional student and excelled in all of her studies. Additionally, she focused on business skill courses, which would eventually open opportunities that led to her career. Beverly had aspirations as a singer and was also a member of a local Bergen County group that was offered a recording contract. Due to the untimely death of the founding member/lead musician, the group disbanded and the contract was rescinded.

In the Winter of 1964, Beverly married Robert S. Randolph, II. To their union, two children were born: Robert S. Randolph III and Sonya R. Randolph-Squitieri. Beverly was a wife and homemaker until the youngest child entered Grade 2.

In the early 1970's, Beverly secured a per-diem job as a Clerk-Typist working for a subdivision of Passaic County's Board of Social Services. Soon thereafter, she became a full time employee in the DCU-Unit as a Data Entry Specialist. Later, she would be transferred from the Passaic Office to the Paterson Office as a Supervisor to work in the Child Support Unit where she would remain until her retirement in 2013.

Beverly was active in the Passaic community during her years as a resident. In the 1980's, she served two terms as the Commissioner of Passaic Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. For over a decade, she worked during elections at the Poll location in School #3. She was also a Notary Republic for over 20 years.

Beverly loved her extended family and was an active member of the Starr Family Reunion Planning Committee. She also enjoyed the Women's Retreat Ministry at Mt. Pilgrim Missionary Baptist Church.
