After graduating from Nelson Street Girls RC School, she attended Providence Girls Catholic School where she earned her diploma. She was an excellent seamstress and cook. She could create and sew any outfit in no time at all and whip up a tasty meal that everyone enjoyed. Elodie was always eager to improve her life especially after giving birth to her daughter Donna.

In 1968, she left her daughter and her family in pursuit of more opportunities in the United States.
