On August 25, 1936 in Robeson County, North Carolina a baby was born to J.D. and Amanda Granger-Jones, named Catherine. Catherine was one of 9 children. She was preceded in death by her parents and siblings.

Catherine received her early education in the Robeson County School System. She attended and accepted God at an early age at the First Baptist Church of Fairmount, NC. Catherine enjoyed her childhood with her siblings and good friends in North Carolina. Her stories of growing up in the South, picking cotton, dealing with acts of racism and discrimination but always knowing that her dad, brothers and uncles and most of all God was there to protect her brought a sense of value to her.

In 1960, Catherine migrated north to New Jersey where she joined other family who made the move. Catherine met and married Howard Glee Sr. and of this union 9 children was born. Newark, NJ is where they made their home and bought their family home on Vermont Avenue in the Vailsburg section of Newark where they would raise their children. Catherine made sure that her family was cared for and loved. There was no doubt of her love for family. Despite the large family she always made room for other children. She ran a summer play street at Abington Avenue as well as on Howell Place in Newark, NJ to provide the neighborhood kids a safe place to enjoy their summer, have food to eat and grow as human beings and also work with the Speedy Summer Employment Program.

Catherine was very involved in the communities where she lived. Her early battles with North Ward politicians for the community was well known and appreciated in the Black community but not by others. Catherine was very outspoken on different causes but never back down from a fight!

Catherine worked for the Newark Board of Education for 27 ½ years as a Teachers Assistant retiring in 1995. She worked at various schools the most memorable being Abington Avenue School where she would meet some of her lifelong friends and touch lives of countless students who kept in touch with her until her death. Catherine also worked at the now closed Upsala College in East Orange, NJ. She retired as a Seargent in the Security department. For years Catherine worked two full time jobs for her family but she had trained her children how to care for each other. Her children never went hungry and always had clean clothing to wear. Howard and Catherine also 'raised' her younger sisters children: Earl, Amanda and Derrick. Catherine was tasked with caring for her younger sister Gerogianna upon her relocation to New Jersey from North Carolina, so Gergianna children became her's also. Going to the Salvation Army and Goodwill to get clothes you would never know that they were second hand because once she finished washing and pressing them, they looked brand new. The children never went without love and without an understanding of God as Catherine BROUGHT her children to church.

She "TRAINED" her kids how they should go but never forced a relationship with God on them.

Catherine joined the Bethlehem Baptist Church in 1976 under the leadership of the Reverend Steve C. Henderson, Sr. She was not just a pew member CATHERINE WORKED! She was in the Missionary Society, Pastor's Aide, Women's Ministry. She worked with First Lady Henderson with the youth with the Sunshine Band, Red Circle Girls, Junior Mission and etc. She later became president or the Pastor's Aide in the early ministry of the Reverend Toney E. Jackson, Sr. and served well.

Catherine relocated in 1999 to La Grange, GA and married John Russell in that same year. Upon relocating, Catherine joined the St. Paul Baptist Church of La Grange. Catherine served as a Deaconess, Women's Ministry President, Sunday School Teacher and Missionary. John closed his eyes to this world in 2003. She relocated back to New Jersey and rejoined the Bethlehem Baptist Church under the leadership of Reverend Toney E. Jackson, Sr. Catherine became the President of the Deaconess Ministry and during this time of service being led by the Holy Spirit, Pastor Jackson and Deaconess Russell was able to consecrate over 5 women to the service of Deaconess. Most of the women are still serving in that capacity today. In 2005, Catherine was led to relocate back to La Grange, GA where she continued her service to the Lord's Kingdom and not to the church building.

In 2012, Catherine married Deacon Thomas S. Goss of La Grange, GA. This union would provide Catherine with a love that had escaped her until then. Working together in ministry in the local church of Saint Paul Baptist Church in La Grange. GA as well as feeding the community breakfast on Monday mornings brought tremendous joy to them both. This union was truly a God-send to the both of them at a vital time in their lives.

Because of both of their illnesses they relocated to Mesquite, Texas to be cared for their daughter Jannifer. On May 26, 2019, Thomas and Catherine joined the Mount Zion Baptist Church, virtually, of Westwood, NJ. The church's Pastor was their son Reverend Bernard D. Glee. They both participated in virtual worship service, Bible study and Intercessory Prayer each week. In May 2021, at the direction of God, Thomas went home to be with the Lord. With Jannifer's illness, Catherine relocated one more time on this earth to Goldsboro, North Carolina to be cared for her eldest child – Walter and his wife Paula in 2022.

On May 21, 2023 @ 1:11 AM God called Catherine home to her final resting place.

(Karen) Irvington, NJ. Five step-children Thomas (DeAndra); Sean (Trenicka) and Falandria (Carlton) Atlanta, GA; Cornelius (Jacklyn) Pineview, GA and Gail (Earl) Lauderhill, FL. 26 grandchildren and 19 great-grandchildren and 1 great-great grandchild. 1 cousin Thomas of Lumberton, North Carolina and 1 aunt Queen Granger of Orange, NJ. A host of nieces, nephews and other relatives and friend. Son Donald and granddaughters Samantha and Stephanie preceded her in death.
