Diane Grace Hunt, 60, from Harlem, New York, passed away peacefully on Wednesday, April 26th, 2023 after a lengthy battle with cancer. She was born on April 4th, 1963 to Mary Sarah Milam in Manhattan, New York. Even though Diane was an only child, she grew up with a very close-knit family and was never short of friends.

Diane joined the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on August 28th, 1988, and there she was welcomed into another family. During her career with the FBI, she received numerous awards for her assistance on various cases throughout her 34 years. Notably, she also worked through and was a vital part of history following the events of September 11th, 2001. Diane was known around the office as the "Plant Lady;" if you had any questions or needed to know how to care for a particular type of plant, she was the person to speak with. She retired on December 31st, 2022.

Diane was a kind and thoughtful soul, especially when it came to animals, babies, and her plants. Her hobbies outside of the office included crocheting, endlessly talking to her friends on the phone, and listening to music, especially anything from the artist formerly known as Prince. Diane was always interested in learning and would often use YouTube to learn things like how to rewire a lamp, make butter from scratch, or even a new language; she was always interested in learning French and Spanish. But Diane loved her two sons, Malcolm and Prince, above all. Whenever she got the chance to talk about them, she always got a twinkle in her eye and flashed the biggest smile on her face, one that could light up any room.

Diane is survived by her two loving sons, Malcolm Xavier Hunt and Prince Dana Hunt. Remaining family left to mourn her are her loving cousins, Arden Haughton and Francoise Nwabueze, and their families. She will be missed by numerous friends and colleagues.
