On Friday, May 5, 2023, God sent an angel down to earth to escort Gerald Francis Sr. from earth to his heavenly home. Heaven's reward was realized at 7:30PM.

GERALD FRANCIS was born November 23, 1953, during the Civil Rights Movement, at a time of great turbulence and great possibilities. The Louisiana Bus Boycott in 1953 was the first large-scale boycott of a southern segregated bus system. It inspired the Montgomery Bus Boycott that took place two years later. Perhaps it is what fueled Gerald's resilient, and determined spirit from a small child growing up in Hackensack, NJ at an unsettling time during the Civil Rights Movement. This pivotal time in history laid the foundation for a young man full of dreams, optimism, and promise.

Gerald was a gift to his parents, Gilbert & Doris Francis, who preceded him in death. During their lives, he was a dedicated, dutiful and loving son. Born at Hackensack Hospital in Hackensack, NJ, Gerald was the third of five children.

Gerald was a proud student of the Hackensack school system, where he excelled in Woodshop at the High School level. There, he would learn the basics of woodworking and how to use various tools to create, repair and assemble woodworking projects. It is there that he honed his carpentry and woodworking techniques. He was crafty and enjoyed creating. He loved gardening and planting beautiful flowers in the yard. One of his favorite escapes were outdoor exploration and classic beach town fun with his grandsons, Tristyn, Taevian, Jaylin and Eli with whom he shared a special closeness. Summers spent at Rehoboth Beach located on the Delaware shores with his family were magical.

In 1981, he met and married the love of his life, Darleen "DeDe" Francis. From this union, they were blessed with two sons, Gerald Francis Jr. of Hackensack, NJ and Reggie Francis of Elmwood Park, NJ. Gerald and DeDe enjoyed 40 plus years of marriage.

Gerald retired as a Rochelle Park Postal Service employee after 30 years of service. Not one for sitting around with nothing to do post-retirement, he then became a valuable member of the City of Hackensack's Crossing Guards where he served the people for 15 years at Central Avenue and First Street. Gerald was a dedicated and dependable employee who took great pride in his work whether at the Post Office or serving as a crossing guard.

Gerald joined the Elks Lodge, a Fraternal organization located in Hackensack. It was formed to promote and practice the four cardinal virtues of charity, justice, brotherly love and fidelity to encourage the wellness of its members and to inspire the spirit of patriotism and good fellowship. The Hackensack Elks have made it a personal goal to raise awareness of programs and resources available to our community's kids and vulnerable groups. Gerald was ever proud of his dedication to the organization and was named Grand District Special Deputy. He was Exalted Ruler for 10 years as well as House Chairmen for Majestic Lodge #153. It was through his tireless efforts for the organization and ultimately people in the community, that inspired this distinct recognition amongst his Fraternal brothers.

Gerald was the beloved husband to his dear wife, DeDe Francis, and perhaps his greatest honor and achievement was becoming the dedicated father to his two sons Gerald Jr. and Reginald.

Gerald carried a gregarious energy with his all too often "mind your business" quipping's. He was in many ways, the rock of the immediate and extended family. He was a kind soul who enjoyed travel, was a sports enthusiast who thoroughly enjoyed being in attendance at NY Giants football games where he loved supporting his favorite team. He was an avid fan! He really enjoyed passing the time listening to R&B and Jazz music, his favorite genres of music.

Gerald was loved dearly and will be greatly missed by his devoted wife, DeDe Francis. Also, his beloved sons, Gerald Jr. and Reginald. His legacy lives on through his sons blessing him with four beautiful grandsons, Tristyn, Taevian, Jaylin and Eli who inspired him daily to dream even bigger dreams for their futures. Gerald loved unselfishly, embodied humility in all he did, and had the courage to be true to himself, like so many of the strong and dynamic people in his life.

Gerald was preceded in death by his beloved parents, Gilbert and Doris Francis and sibling, Tee Francis.
