Obituary

On snowy days, Johnnie would go over to Jamaica Estates and ride down the hills.

Johnnie graduated from Francis Lewis High school in Queens. Johnnie was a part of the 1969 graduating class. Johnnie was also among the first to racially integrate the high school. After graduating Johnnie became an electrical apprentice. He later worked his way up to a journeyman position. Johnnie was a member of the international Brotherhood of Electrical workers local 3.

Johnnie was always working. He loved to stay busy. If he was not repairing cars or trucks he would be remodeling homes. He often said " Why should I pay someone when I could do it myself." That was one of the many infamous comments of Johnnie Jeffries.

At age 16 Johnnie started working at a local mechanic shop. It was there that Johnnie discovered his passion for trucks. His boss took him for a ride and showed him how to operate it. The rest was history.

As the years went by Johnnie calling for trucks grew stronger. Johnnie created his own truck driving company Five D line Inc. Five D represented his five daughters. Five D online Inc was a very thriving business. Johnnie eventually owned 5 trucks.
