Larry's later years were marked by his deep devotion to his family, particularly his daughters, granddaughters, and great-granddaughters. He found joy in spending quality time with them, creating lasting memories.

On June 1, 2024, Larry transitioned peacefully at home in his favorite chair, watching his favorite station, MSNBC. He was preceded in death by his loving wife Marjorie and his beloved son Laurance John. He leaves behind his daughters, Sandra and Susan (both of Manhattan, New York), his son David (Queens New York), his sister Betty, granddaughters Shelley, Lauren, and Raina, and great-granddaughters Jordan, Madison, and Mariah. Larry is also survived by his nieces Tracy, Denise, and Lauri, along with a host of other nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
