After giving her life to Christ, Rose became a dedicated member and served in various capacities while in the church. She served as an Usher; greeter and she sang in the choir. She was the mother of the church and led GRF's Morning Glory Prayer sessions on Tuesday mornings.

Mama Rose as she was affectionately called by family members and friends, was a prayer warrior, and every Friday along with her prayer partner, Pastor Teressa Gordon not only prayed for one another, but they prayed for the Body of Christ and others. Her favorite scripture was Psalms 91. She prayed that her sons would come to know and serve the God that she loved and served. She was a member of the International F. & A.M. Masons, the Order of the Eastern Star, and Bethune Grand Chapter, Georgia Benjamin Grand District No. 7. She was also a member of Lady Alethia Chapter #188 Paterson, NJ, and the Chaplain for her Chapter and always was asked to be the Chaplain for other sisters alongside Brother David Edwards.

Rose gave so much of her love, time, and energy to her sons. She had a special bond with each of them. She would keep it real with her oldest son Christopher, and have heartfelt conversations about life and love with Kareem. Her bond with the twins was evident in many things that she did. She was always making sure that they were well taken care of. Although Antonio moved to Alabama, they would always keep in contact by talking on the phone.

She loved helping others, and gave back to the community by volunteering at the Grandparent Relatives Care Senior Community Resource Center Inc, in Paterson. She was always attending various events, charities, and giving herself to make life easier and better for others. Rose enjoyed traveling so much that she had to update her passport numerous times. On her family reunion cruise in August 2023 she smiled, danced and visited various locations. On the tour of Ocho Rios, Jamaica the tour guide constantly told her how beautiful she was, and he wanted her to sit in the front seat so he could look at her from time to time. During dinner one night on the cruise, Rose and her sister Elizabeth (Kitty) started singing one of Rose's favorite Tina Turner songs. She had the entire restaurant staff and patrons singing along with them and doing the dance moves to the song.

Rose loved to sing and dance and was often called the queen of line dancing. She enjoyed eating at Olive Garden with her close friend and confidant Doreen Carter. She would talk and visit her long-time good friend/sister Barbara Bazemore who would often take care of many household duties to ease Rose's load. Rose also had a special bond with her friend Edythe Gibson. They would talk often about their children and how important it was to show up for the people you love.

When Rose became sick, she didn't want to let her illness slow her down. She continued to visit her parents daily, watch various game shows such as Law & Order, and sports, even though she wasn't a sports fan, and started working part time for the City of Paterson as a Crossing Guard to keep busy.

On Wednesday, October 2, 2024, Rose Mary departed this life.
