# OBITUARY

**Claudio Jamieson**, a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and cherished member of the Panamanian and Brooklyn communities, passed away peacefully at the age of 73.

Born at home in 1951 in Panama City, Panama, Claudio was the only son among many daughters, born to Gloria Cecilia Cadet Jamieson and Claude Oswald “Ossie” Jamieson, both talented in tailoring and seamstressing. He attended Republica de Venezuela Elementary School in Panama City before immigrating to New York City in 1964 at the age of 13.

Settling in Bushwick, Brooklyn, Claudio attended Halsey Middle School and later moved with his family to the iconic 320 Eastern Parkway in Crown Heights. There, he became a well-known and beloved figure within the Panamanian community. He graduated from Erasmus Hall High School in Flatbush and continued his studies at New York City Technical College, pursuing a career in drafting.

In 1974, while attending college, Claudio met the love of his life, Dalila Cecilia Aguilar, also of Brooklyn by way of Panama. The two married that same year and built a beautiful life together, welcoming two sons: Claudio Osvaldo Jamieson Jr. in 1974 and Giovanni Antonio Jamieson in 1979.

Claudio’s work ethic was instilled in him from a young age, growing up in a family that valued hard work and mutual support. He began his career at Rheingold Brewery before transitioning into banking, working at Chemical Bank and Citibank. As technology evolved, Claudio embraced new opportunities in Information Systems and Computer Networking, working at ISO, Pershing Technologies, Chase Manhattan Bank Information Systems, and NorthShore Long Island Jewish Hospital System. In 2011, after a fulfilling career, he and Dalila retired to Panama to enjoy the fruits of their labor.

Claudio was a loving husband, father, and grandfather who found joy in family, community, and the culture he so proudly represented. His wisdom, kindness, and laughter will be deeply missed by all who knew him.

He is survived by his devoted wife, Dalila; his sons, Claudio Jr. and Giovanni; and his three cherished granddaughters, Abigail, Claudia, and Anya. He also leaves behind his sisters, Celia, Alma, and Sandra, along with many nieces, nephews, cousins, and dear friends. He was preceded in death by his parents Gloria and Ossie, and older sisters, Norma, and Marva.

Claudio’s legacy of love, perseverance, and community will live on in the hearts of those he touched.
